Queens West Lt. Governor Janice Bar opened the inaugural DEI Committee meeting at 7:15 PM because people were asked to eat first. Janice gave a brief overview of the DEI Committee's intended goals and purpose and asked the Kiwanians in attendance for their expectations and reason for attending the meeting. Some topics and issues that were brought to the floor were:

- **Personal Attacks and Affronts against members based on Religion**
- **Bullying and Mean-Spirited behaviors towards others in Kiwanis**
- **The lack of Accountability from NY District and Kiwanis International**
- **Use of Non-Sectarian Blessings and Prayers at meetings and events**
- **The need to educate ALL Kiwanis Members about DEI**
- **The effects of finances on the young people considering membership into Kiwanis.**
- **To develop/create a presentation for members to access on DEI**
- **How to get the word out most effectively to all Kiwanians**
- **The DEI Committee wants to interclub with Chinatown Club**

Bob Monahan distributed literature and materials, created by Kiwanis International, on Diversity, Equity and Inclusion to those who were in attendance for their review and discussion. All those present had an opportunity to state their intentions for attending the meeting and their hopes and goals to combat the culture of self-serving agendas in a SERVICE organization that strives to be Diverse, Equitable and Inclusive in ALL of their projects, meetings and activities.

At that point in the meeting, a motion was made to nominate Bob Monahan as Chairperson for this committee, the motion was seconded & the Motion Carried Unanimously. Bob respectfully accepted and thanked everyone for their vote of confidence and support.

Janine Mahon asked how many clubs and members were invited to this DEI meeting and LG Janice spoke of those contacted, those who apologized for not being able to attend and the committee intends to continue to seek interested members to join this mission to educate ALL members about DEI.

Millie Mandese stated that maybe many of our members are unaware of DEI in Kiwanis and Joan DeCamp echoed that by stating that she had never seen the literature and printed information from Kiwanis International. There was a brief discussion about the LGBTQ+ aspect of DEI, and that led to a strong suggestion that FORUM selection and Presenters at D-Con and Mid-Winter be PRE-DISCUSSED & DETERMINED, EQUITABLY OFFERED and ANNOUNCED PUBLICLY, PRIOR to members arriving at the conference and seeing what and who would be offered with one day's notice. Why the big secret??

After all, *change isn't the same thing as progress.*

Bob then presented an overview of the 2022 – 2023 Membership statistics and told the committee members that he would forward a copy of this information. The Division lost 26 members; the District lost 84 members and International lost 4,519 members. There were only 3 Districts in the United States that had a positive membership growth, totaling 63 members. The committee immediately started a dialogue on possible reasons for this exodus and were virtually all in agreement that the warmth and comforting embrace for members, old and new, back in the day, has been replaced with a less inviting and unwelcoming culture, leading to massive losses and a lack of interest. Joan DeCamp clearly stated that the days of local businesses and community support has all but disappeared and there is a need to continue to explore new ways to attract service minded individuals into Kiwanis. This is where Diversity comes in.

Although we could have gone on all night, we decided to save some discussion for our next meeting to be held in November. In the true spirit of DEI, ALL those present at this inaugural meeting were respectful, understanding & committed to open dialogue and effective next steps. EVERYONE left the 3-2-1 Clubhouse knowing their voices were heard and feeling that CHANGE IS POSSIBLE.

We understand that the children of the world represent a variety of races, ethnicities, religions, abilities, socioeconomic statuses, gender identities and sexual orientations. Our vision is to be a positive influence in societies worldwide, so that one day, regardless of background, all children wake up in communities that believe in them, nurture them and provide the support they need to survive.

To ensure our vision comes to life, it is imperative that our Kiwanis family welcomes, includes and serves individuals with diverse backgrounds, talents and perspectives. With Kiwanis' worldwide presence, it is critical that we work with and engage members and organizations representing diverse communities throughout all levels of our organization.

Diversity: We commit to increasing diversity and celebrating the range of human differences. Kiwanis clubs shall not discriminate based upon race, color, creed, national origin, age or sex, including sexual orientation and gender identity, when considering membership or during any of their activities or operations.

Equity: We commit to a policy of opportunity that promotes fairness, impartiality and nondiscriminatory actions for all persons — no matter the criteria.

Inclusion: We commit to pursuing efforts to ensure the dignity of all people is recognized, respected, valued and empowered.

CELEBRATING AND FOSTERING INCLUSIVENESS

Another milestone in the organization's longstanding commitment came in 2008, when delegates at the Kiwanis International convention **adopted a resolution** that celebrates inclusiveness and encourages and empowers clubs to create environments that nurture mutual respect. The language reads:

Therefore, be it resolved that the delegates assembled at the 2008 Kiwanis International convention in Orlando, Florida, and all Kiwanis leaders and members to take action to create a culture and club environment that develops and nurtures mutual respect for all and celebrates the inclusiveness of our beloved Kiwanis.

As we begin tonight's meeting, let us refer to Kiwanis International's Commitment to Diversity, Equity and Inclusion. It is something that is at the heart of why we are here, why many of us joined Kiwanis in the first place and what future potential possibilities these words can hold for us.

Diversity: We commit to increasing diversity and celebrating the range of human differences. Kiwanis clubs shall not discriminate based upon race, color, creed, national origin, age or sex, including sexual orientation and gender identity, when considering membership or during any of their activities or operations.

The key words in the Diversity commitment are "shall not discriminate". That can include: Personal Affronts, Attacks and Agendas, Bullying, Gossip, i.e. punishing members and clubs by failing to recognize their successes and accomplishments in Kiwanis. The question therefore is: What other examples would you like to add?

Equity: We commit to a policy of opportunity that promotes fairness, impartiality and nondiscriminatory actions for all persons — no matter the criteria.

This is not just a word or a statement, this is what our mission, this is what our vision needs to embody if we are to end bullying and mean spirited behaviors that often go unchecked and without accountability in Kiwanis. It is what we need to embody if we are to continue as Kiwanis Clubs, if we are to live in the spirit of being, Kiwanians.

Equity, *demands* fairness, impartiality and nondiscriminatory actions for ALL persons – no matter the criteria or circumstance.

Inclusion: We commit to pursuing efforts to ensure the dignity of all people is recognized, respected, valued and empowered.

So moving forward, we must define our purpose, our vision and our commitment to DEI within Queens West Division. This will assure accountability to the policies established by Kiwanis International. We should be ALL IN or ALL OUT!! This is a ZERO TOLERANCE POLICY for blatant acts that violate the principles of Justice, Equity, Diversity and Inclusion.






